



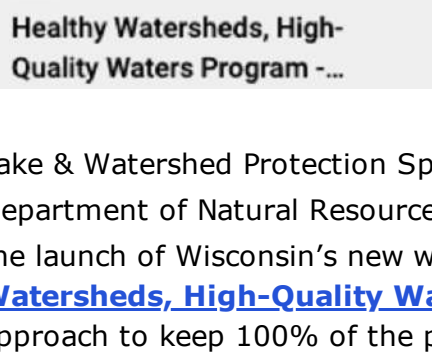

Call for Applications: USACE Floodplain Management Services Program

The Army Corps of Engineers Chicago District planning team is seeking applicants for its Floodplain Management Services (FPMS) program. The FPMS program enables the Corps to provide services to communities to reduce flood risk. It is 100% federally funded, so no cost share is required of communities. Typical FPMS products include flood warning plans, hydraulic & hydrologic modeling, & flood communications plans. These studies do not result in construction but can help communities better manage their local flood risk.

The May 12 LSC Brownbag Webinar is now available for viewing on YouTube. Statewide Lake & Watershed Protection Specialist & NW area Lake Biologist for the WI Department of Natural Resources, Pamela Toshner, shared information about the launch of Wisconsin's new water resources protection program - [Healthy Watersheds, High-Quality Waters](#). The program uses a non-regulatory approach to keep 100% of the priority healthy watersheds & high-quality waters within them at or better than their current conditions through 2030. Priority HUC12 watersheds were identified using a Healthy Watersheds Assessment at the statewide & HUC6 scales, including the Lake Superior basin.

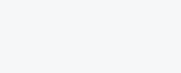
