

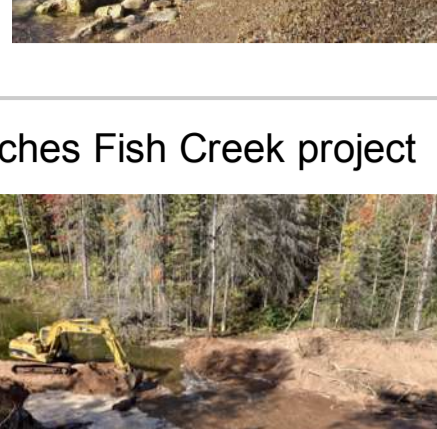

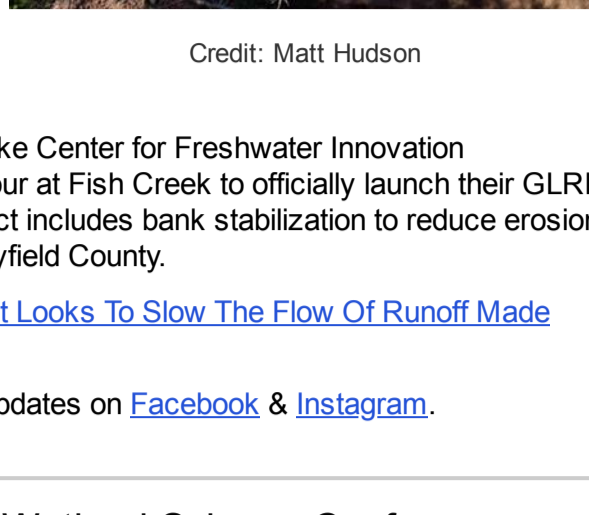
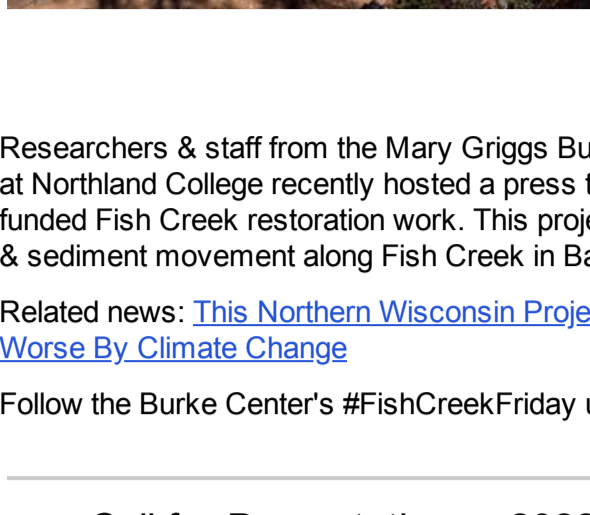

February 15-17, 2022, in Stevens Point

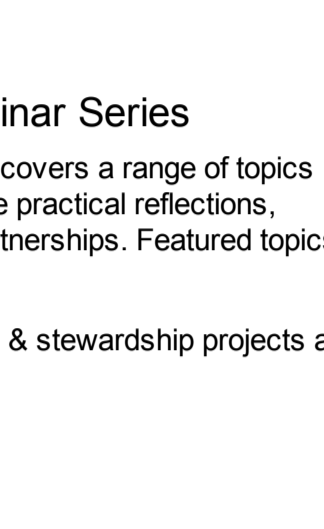

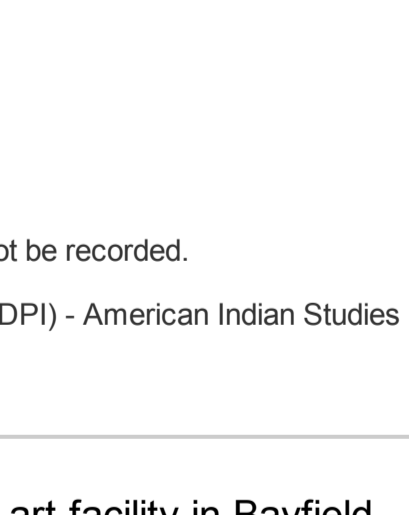
First Nations Studies 2021-2022 Webinar Lecture Series

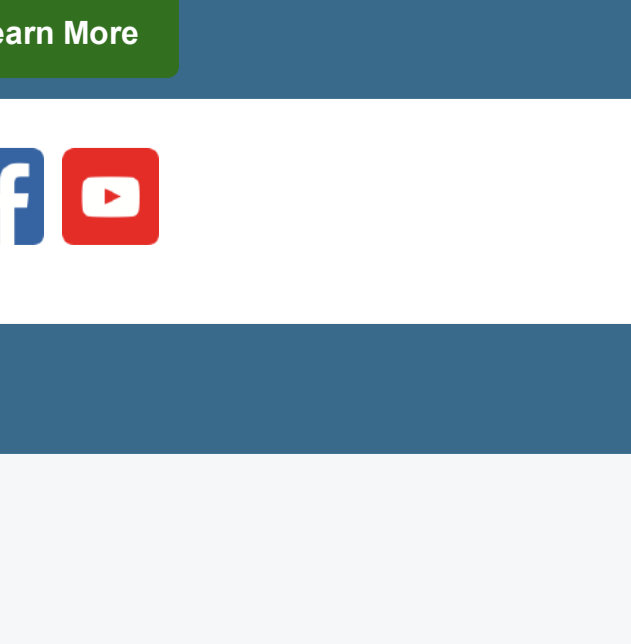

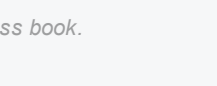

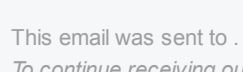
